
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ECONOMIC AND DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS IN

Platte County AND THE SURROUNDING AREA



This study provides data on labor force, employment, commuting patterns, population, migration, retail sales, and income for Platte County. For select measures, comparable data are provided for the surrounding area (selected counties and communities). The map featured above shows the general area for which selected comparable data are shown. In addition to Platte County, other counties included in this area are Boone, Butler, Colfax, Madison, Merrick, Nance, Polk and Stanton. The retail sales section also compares retail growth between Columbus and eight other similarly sized Nebraska communities.

LABOR FORCE AND EMPLOYMENT

Table 1 and Chart 1 (next page) present nonfarm wage and salary data for Platte County for the period 2011–2021. Nonfarm employment is broken down into 11 sectors as defined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and which are compliant with the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS).

Nonfarm wage and salary employment consists of the following 11 sectors:

- Natural Resources & Mining
- Construction
- Manufacturing
- Trade, Transportation & Utilities
- Information
- Financial Activities

- Professional & Business Services
- Education & Health Services
- Leisure & Hospitality
- Other Services (except Public)
- Government

The measure of employment reported in Table 1 is data on the number of people employed in the Nonfarm Wage and Salary (W&S) sector in Platte County (regardless of their county of residence). These data indicate total nonfarm wage and salary employment in Platte County increased 3.2 percent (603 jobs) between 2011 and 2021.

Table 1 and Chart 1 also provide employment data for Platte County by major economic sector for years 2011–2021. The Natural Resources & Mining sector recorded the largest percentage increase in employment between 2011 and 2021 (46.5 percent or 194 jobs). The Manufacturing sector recorded the largest actual employment increase between 2011 and 2021 (601 jobs or 10.9 percent).

Platte County, Nebraska




Chart 2 compares total nonfarm wage and salary employment growth in Platte County with metropolitan, nonmetropolitan and Nebraska as a whole for the review period 2011–2021. Non-metropolitan Nebraska is defined as Nebraska minus the seven Lincoln and Omaha metropolitan counties of Cass, Douglas, Lancaster, Sarpy, Saunders, Seward and Washington.

As this chart indicates, total nonfarm wage and salary employment in Platte County increased 3.2 percent (603 jobs) from 2011 to 2021, compared to a 7.1 percent increase for Nebraska as a whole, an 8.3 percent increase in metropolitan Nebraska and an 18.2 percent increase in non-metropolitan Nebraska.

Platte County, Nebraska, Metro and Non-Metro Nebraska





Chart 3 presents data on manufacturing wage and salary employment growth for Platte County, Nebraska, metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas. The Manufacturing sector for Platte County recorded a 10.9 percent increase in employment (601 jobs) between 2011 and 2021. This compares to an 11.0 percent increase in employment for non-metropolitan Nebraska; a 6.3 percent increase for Nebraska as a whole; and a 6.0 percent increase for metropolitan Nebraska over the same period.

Platte County, Nebraska, Metro and Non-Metro Nebraska





The next series of charts (Charts 4, 5 and 6) displays the distribution of nonfarm wage and salary (W&S) employment by major economic sector in Platte County compared to the non-metropolitan and metropolitan distributions.

When comparing the Platte County employment sectors to non-metropolitan Nebraska, the largest deviation occurs in the Manufacturing sector, which makes up 31.8 percent of the county workforce (6,138 employees) compared to 14.4 percent for non-metropolitan Nebraska, a difference of 17.4 percent. Comparing Platte County to the overall metropolitan distribution, the largest deviation is found in the Manufacturing sector (31.8 percent Platte County vs. 6.6 percent metropolitan Nebraska; a difference of 25.2 percent).

The next table (Table 2) shows labor force information for Platte County for the time period 2011–2021. Labor force data (labor force, unemployment, and total employment) are measured based on the county of residence of the labor force participants (regardless of where they work). As the labor force and total employment data

indicate, there was a decrease in the number of Platte County residents participating in the labor force between 2011 and 2021 (2.8 percent or 495 people).

The number of those unemployed in Platte County decreased by 47.2 percent (351 people) between 2011 and 2021. Persons are classified as unemployed if they do not have a job, have actively looked for work in the prior four weeks, and are currently available for work. The Platte County unemployment rate was 2.1 percent in 2021; below that for metropolitan Nebraska (4.6 percent), below Nebraska as a whole (4.2 percent), and below nonmetropolitan Nebraska (3.5 percent).



RESIDENCE AND WORK FLOW PATTERNS

The next series of tables show residence (Work Destination) and workflow (Home Destination) patterns for Platte County. A Work Destination report looks at where residents in a selected area are working (where they are commuting to work). A Home Destination Report looks at the area from which a county is pulling employees to fill positions. These data are estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau's Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) program. This program uses a variety of statistical and computing techniques to combine federal and state administrative data on employers and employees with core Census Bureau censuses and surveys while protecting the confidentiality of people and firms that provide the data. The most current data available for Platte County are from 2019.

Table 3 (pages 6-7) examines the Work Destination area for Platte County from three perspectives: by state, by county, and by place (city). In Table 3, the Census identified 11,450 county labor force participants holding primary jobs. As Table 3 shows, 97.2 percent of Platte County's labor force participants are employed within the state of Nebraska. Approximately 66.2 percent of Platte County workers remain within Platte County for employment with 33.8 percent leaving the county borders for work (next page). The top ten incorporated places where Platte County labor force participants are employed are also shown on the following page.



People also travel from other locations to work in Platte County—this is the Home Destination Report or the labor shed area. Table 4 (pages 8-9) depicts the home locations of those employed within Platte County. The Census identified 3,808 primary jobs within Platte County. As Table 4 indicates, 97.6 percent of these jobs are held by Nebraska residents. Approximately 59.3 percent of Platte County workers live within the county borders and the top localities show the distribution of employee residents around the area (next page).
















The Distance/Direction Report depicted in Table 9 and Figure 1 shows the number (count) and percentage (share) of primary job holders living in Platte County and the distance they travel to work. Looking at Table 9, the count of primary job holders living within Platte County is greater in 2019 compared to 2017. The distribution of miles traveled to work has shifted slightly since 2017. Figure 1 shows the location and concentration of these workplaces.


Table 10 and Figure 2 show the number (count) and percentage (share) of people employed within Platte County and the distance to their homes. Looking at Table 10, the number of primary jobs held within Platte County has increased since 2017. The data also show the majority of Platte County employees continue to travel less than 10 miles from work to home. Figure 2 shows the concentration of job counts by distance and direction.

POPULATION AND MIGRATION TRENDS

The following tables (Tables 11 and 12) present population trend data for Platte County and the surrounding area. As Table 11 indicates, Platte County's population experienced an average annual increase of 0.5 percent between 1970 and 2010 for a total increase of 21.4 percent or 5,693 people. This population increase compares to an average annual increase of 0.5 percent, 23.0 percent total, for Nebraska as a whole. Platte County reported an average annual 0.5 percent increase in population from 2010 to 2021 (2,004 people total).

Table 12 data reveals the population of Platte County's incorporated places as a whole experienced an average annual population increase of 0.8 percent from 1970 to 2010 and an average annual increase of 0.8 percent from 2010 to 2021 for a total increase of 48.2 percent (8,623 people) from 1970 to 2021. Columbus, the county's largest city, reported a 55.9 percent increase in population (8,652 people) between 1970 and 2021. The unincorporated areas outside of the selected communities experienced a 10.7 percent decrease (926 people) during the period 1970-2021.



The next two charts (Chart 17 and 18, next page) graphically depict the migration patterns for Nebraska, Platte County, and the surrounding area as a percentage of the previous decade. Net migration is the change in population after factoring the natural increase for an area (births minus deaths). For the 2000-2010 decade, Platte County experienced a net out-migration of 1,732 people or 5.5 percent of its 2000 population.

Platte County and the Surrounding Area





The next table and chart (Tables 13 and Chart 19, next page) provide detail on migration patterns. Data reported in these tables are 2017–2021 five-year estimates, which are the latest multiyear estimates available. Multiyear estimates from the American Community Survey are "period" estimates that represent data collected over a period of time (as opposed to "point-in-time" estimates, such as the decennial census, that approximate the characteristics of an area on a specific date). Employment opportunities, cost of living and quality of life influence migration patterns.

Table 13 data show the current population one-year or older is 16 greater than the number of people living in Platte County one-year ago. This indicates Platte County experienced a net increase in its population age one and older and in-migration was greater than out-migration plus the number of deaths.

The 2017–2021 five-year estimates in Chart 19 reveal a net loss of 63 people from other Nebraska counties and a net gain of 206 people from other states for a total net gain of 143 people one-year or older. As shown in Chart 19, net gains occurred in the age groups Age 1 to 17 (gain of 125), Age 18 to 23 (gain of 57), Age 25 to 44 (gain of 188), and net losses in age groups Age 45 to 64, (loss of 184), and Age 65 and over, (loss of 43).

Chart 19 also shows the net gains and losses by educational attainment for persons ages 25 and older. There was a gain in residents with a high school diploma or less (gain of 72) and a loss of residents with a bachelor's degree, associate's degree, or some college (loss of 105) and a graduate or professional degree (loss of 6).

The following chart and table (Chart 20; Table 14) compare the U.S. Census Bureau's age distribution of population for Nebraska as a whole and Platte County. The population of Platte County is older in age than Nebraska as a whole. Platte County and Nebraska





RETAIL SALES

Table 16 and Chart 22 show the retail sales (non-motor vehicle) pull factors for Platte County and the surrounding area for 2022. The pull factor is computed by dividing the per capita taxable, non-motor vehicle (NMV) retail sales by the state average per capita NMV retail sales. A pull factor of one indicates an area has per capita NMV retail sales equal to the state. A value greater than one indicates an area is drawing retail sales from other areas. Conversely, a pull factor with a value less than one indicates the subject area is losing potential retail activity to other places or, in other words, is experiencing retail sales leakage. This simple calculation does not factor in income levels or purchasing power within an area.



Reviewing the pull factors at the county level indicates Platte County experiences net retail leakages. The 2022 pull factor of 0.99 indicates, on a per capita basis, retail sales in Platte County are similar to the state's average per capita sales. Distance from other large trade centers plays a major role in this phenomenon. The comparison of the pull factor for Platte County (0.99) with the pull factor for the non-metropolitan area of Nebraska

(0.85) indicates per capita retail sales in Platte County are 17.1 percent above the average per capita retail sales in the non-metropolitan area of Nebraska.

Table 17 and Chart 23 compare the 2022 pull factors for selected area communities. The Platte County community of Columbus's pull factor of 1.33 indicates that, on a per capita basis, non-motor vehicle retail sales in Columbus are approximately 32.8 percent greater than the state's average per capita sales.




Table 18 (sorted by population) and Chart 24 (sorted by pull factor) further break down the 2022 pull factors into the communities reporting retail sales figures within Platte County. As this table indicates, the community of Columbus had the strongest pull factor (1.33) compared to the other communities reporting in the county. Together, these communities contributed to an overall pull factor of 0.99 for Platte County in 2022.





Chart 26 illustrates the pull factor trend for Columbus, Platte County, non-metropolitan Nebraska, and Nebraska as a whole from 1990 to 2022. In examining the timeline, the city of Columbus shows retail pull fluctuating well above the state average throughout the entire study period. PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME


Chart 27 examines the per capita personal income levels within the study area. The American Community Survey data allows us to look more closely at non-metropolitan areas in Nebraska. Information on income distribution comes from various sources, including earnings, retirement income, and public assistance.

The 2017-2021 five-year estimates show per capita personal income for Platte County is estimated to be \$31,508 compared to \$35,189 for Nebraska as a whole.

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME


Median household income provides a different perspective of income levels than median family or per capita income. Family income is defined as having two or more related people in a household. Household income (used in this study) can consist of multiple family members or can be represented by a single person.

The 2017-2021 five-year estimates show median household income for Platte County is estimated to be \$64,105 compared to \$66,644 for Nebraska as a whole.
