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Loup Power Delivers Lease Payments

COLUMBUS, Neb. — Loup Power District officials recently delivered lease payments totaling more than \$1.7 million to area communities. Each of these communities owns their electric distribution systems. These payments compensate them for the use of those systems for the first quarter of 2023. Communities use the funds for a variety of public projects.
