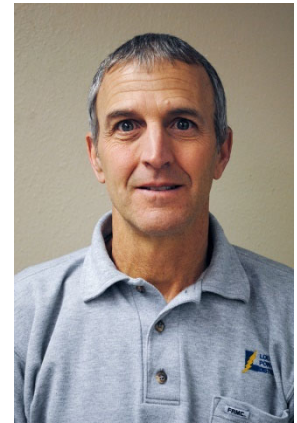

Dale Gasper Marks 35 Years at Loup

COLUMBUS, Neb. — Columbus Division Superintendent Dale Gasper was recently recognized for 35 years of service to Loup Power District.

Gasper joined Loup in 1986 as an Apprentice Lineman at the Humphrey Office. Later that year he was promoted to Lineman. He transferred to the Columbus Service Center in 1989, and was promoted to Journeyman Lineman the following year.

In 2012, Gasper was promoted to Line Foreman at the Columbus Service Center and was named Columbus Division Superintendent at the Columbus Service Center in 2014.



As Division Superintendent, Gasper oversees the construction, operation, and maintenance of the electric system in the Columbus Division, including Columbus, Duncan, Platte Center, Richland, Clarkson, and Howells. He supervises the Columbus line and service crews, working with local contractors, and handling customer contacts regarding new service.

Gasper is a native of Lindsay and a graduate of Newman Grove High School. He earned an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Utility Line from Northeast Community College in Norfolk.

Gasper and his wife, Nancy, are the parents of three sons: Casey, Jesse, and Jaime.
