Langemeier Resigns from Loup Board of Directors

COLUMBUS, Neb. — Chris Langemeier has resigned from the Loup Power District Board of Directors.

Langemeier made the decision to step down after Gov. Jim Pillen appointed him to fill a vacancy on the Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) Board of Directors.

Langemeier represented Subdivision 5, which includes portions of Colfax and Platte Counties. He served on the board for more than six years and was Board Chairman in 2020. He also previously served as a state senator from 2005–2012.

“Director Langemeier’s experience in the Nebraska Legislature and the Natural Resources Committee brought a lot of knowledge to our board and that knowledge will be missed,” said Loup President/CEO Neal Suess.

Langemeier was recognized for his service at the Loup Power District Board of Directors meeting on Aug. 28.
