Brabec was promoted to his current position of Line Foreman at the Columbus Service Center in 2014.



As Line Foreman, Brabec is in charge of the line crew that is responsible for construction and maintenance of Loup's electrical transmission and distribution system in the Columbus Division. The Columbus Division includes the southeastern part of Platte County and part of Colfax County.
